
Senator Hughes Delivers Boost for Education Funding





Take Action: You May Be Eligible for a Property Tax/Rent Rebate!

Are you an older adult or a Pennsylvania resident with a disability? You may be eligible to apply for a rebate of rent and property taxes paid in 2015. **The deadline for applying has been extended to December 31, 2016.**

The rebate program is for the following:

- Pennsylvanians age 65 and older
- **Widows and widowers age 50 and older**
- People with disabilities age 18 and older
- Income of \$35,000 a year or less for homeowners; \$15,000 a month for renters
