Mantua Square Opening Brings New Life Into the Community

The Philadelphia Housing Authority (PHA) invested significant dollars in the award-winning Mantua Square at 35th Street and Fairmount Avenue in West Philadelphia. This \$28.1 million investment helps the development make a bold statement toward addressing the blight that has

plagued the community over the past 50 years and sets an example for other developers through the sustainable, efficient use of land and buildings. I was also successful in working with the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency and other state agencies to secure more than \$16 million for this project.

In October, I was pleased and honored to be on hand to help cut the ribbon and tour this innovative development. The sustainable, efficient use of land and buildings also serve as an example to other developers.

The development is comprised of a mixture of walk-up apartments and duplexes totaling 101 units. The square surrounds a gated courtyard with ample green space. The green space helps with storm water management. Photovoltaic solar panels with the capability of generating up to 200 megawatts of power annually are mounted on the roof.

The redeveloped site also contains 7,400 square feet of commercial space, intended to attract more businesses to the area.

Senator Hughes Secures Funding for Mt. Vernon Arms in Mantua

I joined with the Pennsylvania Housing and Finance Agency and the City of Philadelphia's Redevelopment Authority to help fund the Mt. Vernon Manor Phase I renovation. Mt. Vernon Manor was awarded a \$250,000 planning grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to create a revitalization plan for the entire Mantua neighborhood with Mt. Vernon Manor serving as the anchor for this revitalization.

Mt. Vernon Manor Phase I is a major renovation of 75 of 125 affordable family apartments located within six of the community's nine buildings. Total development cost is \$16.5 million, of which the PHFA will invest and lend approximately \$12 million and the City of Philadelphia's Redevelopment Authority will contribute \$4 million.

Construction will commence in March 2012 and be completed in August 2013. The exterior appearance of the buildings and the surrounding site will change dramatically. Mt. Vernon Manor will operate with greater stability and provide for a very high quality living environment.

With this state investment, there is the possibility of securing a major federal grant to assist with the completion of Mt. Vernon Arms. If completed, the Mantua neighborhood is then eligible for \$20 to \$30 million in HUD funding to continue the redevelopment.

Strawberry Mansion Revitalization Tour

Last year, I joined with City Council President Darrell Clarke, Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency Executive Director Brian Hudson, and Philadelphia Housing Authority Executive Director Michael Kelly to tour the Strawberry Mansion neighborhood.

Our purpose was to review potential opportunities to invest in this important neighborhood.

There are significant revitalization efforts happening in Strawberry Mansion. The Friends Rehabilitation Program (FRP) is working to rehabilitate 10 historic homes in partnership with the

community. In 2011, they built 24 new and one newly restored energy-efficient homes for low and moderate income first-time buyers on North 31st Street.

I'm happy that I was able to help with this worthy project. It is imperative that we do more for this deserving community, especially during this time of economic uncertainty. Now more than ever, it is important to partner with people who share our vision, and who have the ability to make things happen. Council President Clarke, Brian

Hudson, and Michael Kelly are people who understand this neighborhood and its potential.

Friends Rehabilitation
Program (FRP) is a Quaker-related nonprofit whose mission is to provide housing and social services for low and moderate income households. FRP partners with neighborhood organizations to build quality, energy-efficient homes for low and middle income first-time homebuyers.





Springfield: Developing Comprehensive Plan for Flood Problems

In September, following devastating flooding due to Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee, I joined with leaders in Springfield Township to assess the damage and decide on the best way to help this community, and its homes and businesses that were severely damaged by flooding.

I have introduced Senate Bill 1401 that creates the Homeowner and Small Business Flood Control and Prevention Loan Program. This legislation would provide low interest

loans to homeowners and small businesses to purchase and install products that minimize the impact of flooding on one's property.

By encouraging and assisting property owners to take steps to 'flood-proof' their homes and businesses, damage from future flooding events can be potentially mitigated and can provide residents with peace of mind that their homes are adequately protected.

Outside of major weather events, residents in Springfield Township, Philadelphia and suburban communities experience multiple floods per year solely because of storms. This legislation would help to ease the damage incurred to these communities due to flooding.

In partnership, with local officials, I have put together a working group to stay focused on putting a plan together to address flood issues and develop ideas to implement this plan.

Senator Hughes Convenes Infrastructure Summit

Senator Hughes recently convened an Infrastructure Summit at Temple University. The summit featured panels of experts who discussed a wide range of infrastructure, economic development and job creation ideas and issues. He brought together leading experts to come up with solutions to address Pennsylvania's infrastructure crisis.



Increased investment in transportation, housing, information technology, school buildings for K-12 and college student housing, is essential. Each of those facilities must be brought up to the 21st Century in order for this region to compete internationally. "When we invest in those areas, we put people to work, and we revitalize our overall economy. This is a mandate that has a local focus, but has also been put on the priority list by President Obama," Senator Hughes said.

Senator Hughes moderates a group of panelists during the infrastructure summit.

Senator Hughes convened leaders from the White House, Philadelphia Industrial Development Authority, PA Housing Finance Agency, SEPTA, PENNDOT, PA Turnpike Commission, the Philadelphia School District, and several other organizations to focus on infrastructure needs in Pennsylvania. 

In November, Senator Hughes held his annual 'Show Me All the Money' seminar geared toward financially empowering participants at the new West Philadelphia High School. It was intended to assist constituents navigate the current economic downturn.

Nearly 1,000 attendees were on hand for my economic empowerment conference entitled, 'Show Me All the Money.'

The event, which took place at the new West Philadelphia High School located at 49th and Chestnut streets, focused on helping individuals learn to maintain, manage and maximize their financial well being during tough economic times.

A host of local experts provided a wide array of resources to assist participants in every area of their personal finances and family affairs.

Activities included panel discussions workshops, demonstrations and personal


